







Do you feel things in the country are going in the right direction, or do you feel things have gotten off on the wrong track?






How would you rate the job Barack Obama has been doing as President? Do you approve or disapprove of the job he is doing?


How would you rate the job Barack Obama has been doing as President? Do you approve or disapprove of the job he is doing?







Did you vote in the November 2014 elections for Congress?



What drove your vote for Congress? Would you say it was...



What do think is the most important issue that Congress should be dealing with next year? Would you say it is...



The role of government and how government does its work, or Issues facing the country?



Government should do more to solve problems and help meet the needs of people; or Government is doing too many things better left to businesses and individuals?









Just about always, Most of the time, Only some of the time, or Never?




How much would you say that you trust your state government?

Would you say that you approve or disapprove of U.S. efforts against ISIS?





Very worried, Somewhat worried, Not too worried, or Not at all worried?










Do you believe that the next generation will be better off economically than the current generation?






Do you think that the Affordable Care Act, also called Obamacare, went too far, did not go far enough, or was about right?


